AGRICULTURAL AND WORKING LANDS CONSERVATION PLAN (AWLCP)

Working Lands, Working Artists engages local artists in the design and installation of public art/creative placemaking projects exploring Mariposa's relationship with agriculture and working landscapes. This project is intended to support Mariposa County Planning Department's Agriculture and Working Lands Conservation Plan (AWLCP) and aligns with recommendations in the Mariposa County Creative Placemaking Strategy.

Agricultural and Working Lands Conservation Plan (AWLCP) is a planning project that supports sustainability for the County's agricultural landscapes and lifeways. The art concepts created by selected Working Lands, Working Artists artists are informed by, and respond to, community input gathered during the AWLCP's initial stakeholder engagement process.

ONLINE SURVEY

Selected artists are working with the Working Lands, Working Artists and AWLCP team and the public to refine their designs. The Arts Council hosts individual online surveys and in-person engagement events for each artists' designs, whereby the public can review and offer constructive feedback.

Selected artist Erica Wolfsen is working with the Mariposa County Planning Department to design site specific murals situated in Coulterville County Park.

In-person management was conducted during Banderita Days, a fourday community festival, where Erica met community members and invited them to view, ask questions, and supply feedback on her current mural concepts. The accompanying online survey took place August 24 -September 10.



Concept Support

Erica's concepts focus on three key narratives: pastureland, pollinators, and flood and fire, in response to input collected in the AWLCP stakeholder engagement process.

The overwhelming majority of all respondents were in favor of the mural concepts as evidenced by positive suggestions and thoughtful commentary via written responses in both the in-person and online engagement processes. Approximately 9% of all submitted comments were critical of the project. Nearly 8% of submitted comments offered feedback that was not germane to the project.

Suggestions and Contributions

I hope to see some of our native plants/trees etc on the pasture land. Along with cattle and horses, etc

Just that it would be cool if there were a way for local agricultural producers to somehow leverage this work. Like, if honey producers could sell honey by the bee mural; if ranchers could sell beef by the pasture mural, etc.

One concern is the wood fence. What shape is it in and how long will it hold up? From pictures you can see the fence gets hit by the sprinklers, what will this do to the paint? Should the fence be replaced first with different materials that will hold up better than wood? It is a big area to paint and will look lovely, I just want to see that it will last for years to come. I think adding more nature to the back of the stage would look beautiful with the colors. Almost like a sunrise effect maybe?

As an art person myself, I suggest you use an acrylic medium to give the paint a "plasticity"...that is a three dimensional look...in an attempt to emphasize the shapes, pattern and contours of the honeycomb, maybee even crafting a bee-behind out of resin and position them projecting out of a few of the honeycomb holes. Just a thought.

In addition to adding dimensionality to the honeycombs that thicker paint could also bee used to make the "honey" really look like it has been poured over on top of the honeycomb!

What doesn't resonate with me are the fun facts & sayings on the bee mural; I feel like this could be incorporated on a plaque of sorts near the shed instead like a BeeSaving Guide. They are informative, but I think that the community can be informed w/o all the info blasted on the building itself like an infomercial. Maybe even painting a quote or poem about bees on the mural instead? I feel like most people who live in our area understand the importance of bees. It'd be great to add what Coulterville represents to us in one-word statements to one of the larger murals either on the stage or fence.

I would prefer to see some poppies somewhere in the concept. Should be more representative of the areasunset over mountain peaks with a howling coyote featured.	 The bumble bee part I didn't really get? I see and understand what you are doing with this particular work but for me it "doesn't FEEL right" for this area. It looks like something you would see in a "big city" art gallery. Being a member of the shindig committee, the group that built the stage, I do not think that this is what we had envisioned. I do not understand the relation of the design to the area. Not unique enough to the area. I don't "get"the "bee/honey thing" connection to NorthSide-Coulterville, Mariposa. I'd personally much prefer a more 1850's-1890's western-prospector-gold mining themeas that is what the area was about and why it came into being. I imagine a 'tribute reference' to the Miwok is 'nice', but perhaps not as relevant to many, especially tourists. I prefer "entertainment" and "wow" as a more effective and broader marketing tool, than education or interpretive art. Not a whole lotat all. It's very pastoral, pleasing and "artsy", but IMO, lacks excitement and 'draw'. I've seen dozens of top western tourists town murals and by and large the 'best' murals focus on themes that bring excitement and entertainment, especially to tourists. Let's not focus on disaster.
